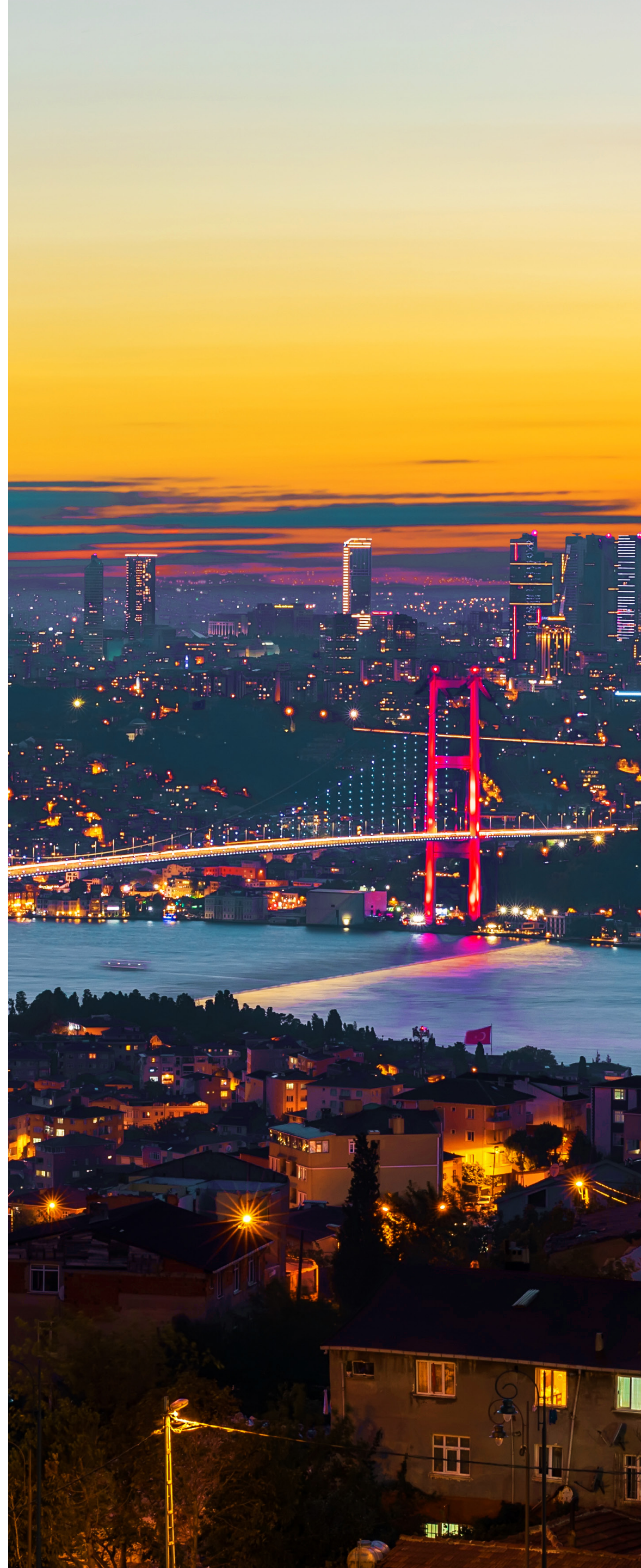

Hagia Sophia

A masterpiece of Byzantine architecture, Hagia Sophia has stood for over 1,500 years as a church, a museum, and now a mosque. Its massive dome, intricate mosaics, and grand history make it one of the world's most significant cultural treasures.



Dolmabahçe Palace

Once the opulent residence of Ottoman sultans, Dolmabahçe Palace is a masterpiece of European-style architecture blended with Ottoman elegance. Its crystal chandeliers, grand staircases, and intricately designed rooms reflect the wealth and power of the empire. Another aspect that makes Dolmabahçe Palace very special for Turks is that it was the house where Mustafa Kemal Atatürk spent his last days. The palace's location on the Bosphorus offers breathtaking views, making it a must-visit for history and architecture lovers.



Galata Tower

Also known as the Galata Kulesi Museum, an iconic symbol situated in the Galata quarter of İstanbul, Türkiye. Considered among the oldest towers in the world and one of the symbols of İstanbul, Galata Tower (Galata Kulesi) was included in the UNESCO World Heritage Temporary List in 2013. Galata Tower, one of the most important structures that make up the silhouette of İstanbul, was used as a long-term fire watchtower and was named Galata Fire Tower.



Grand Bazaar

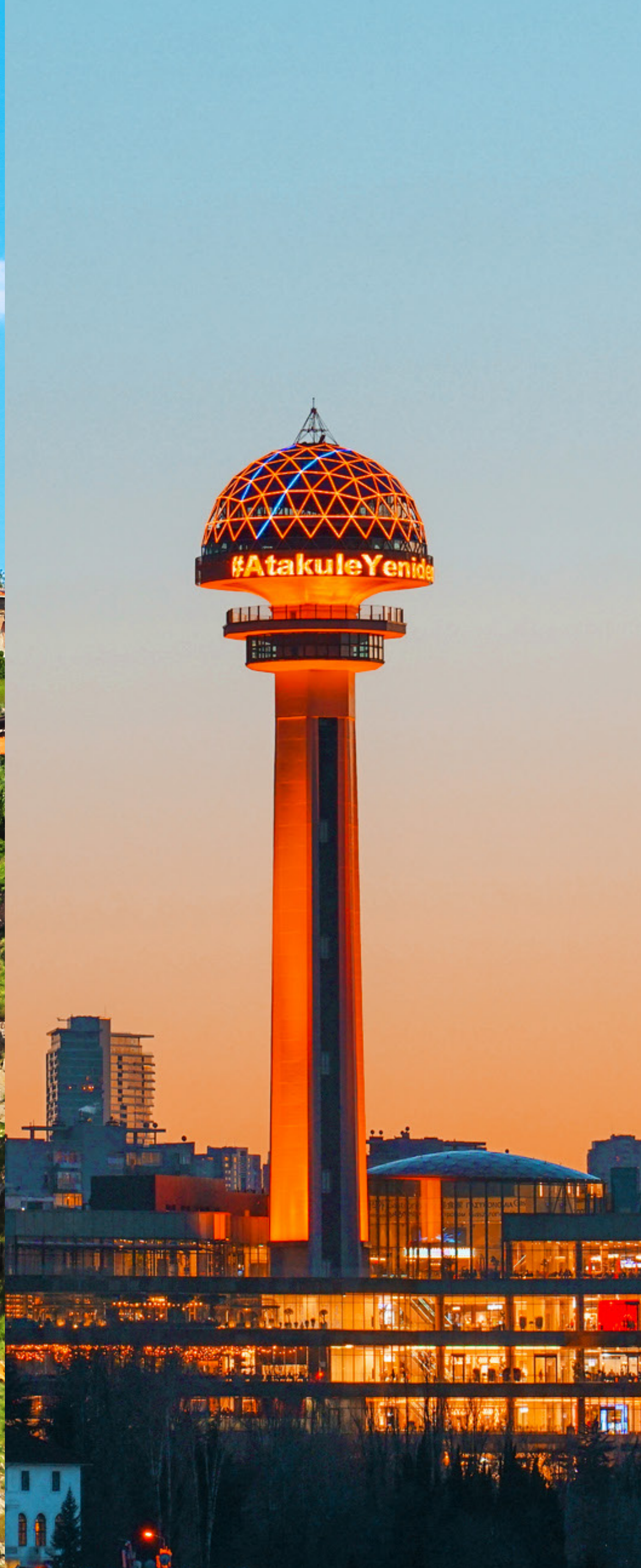

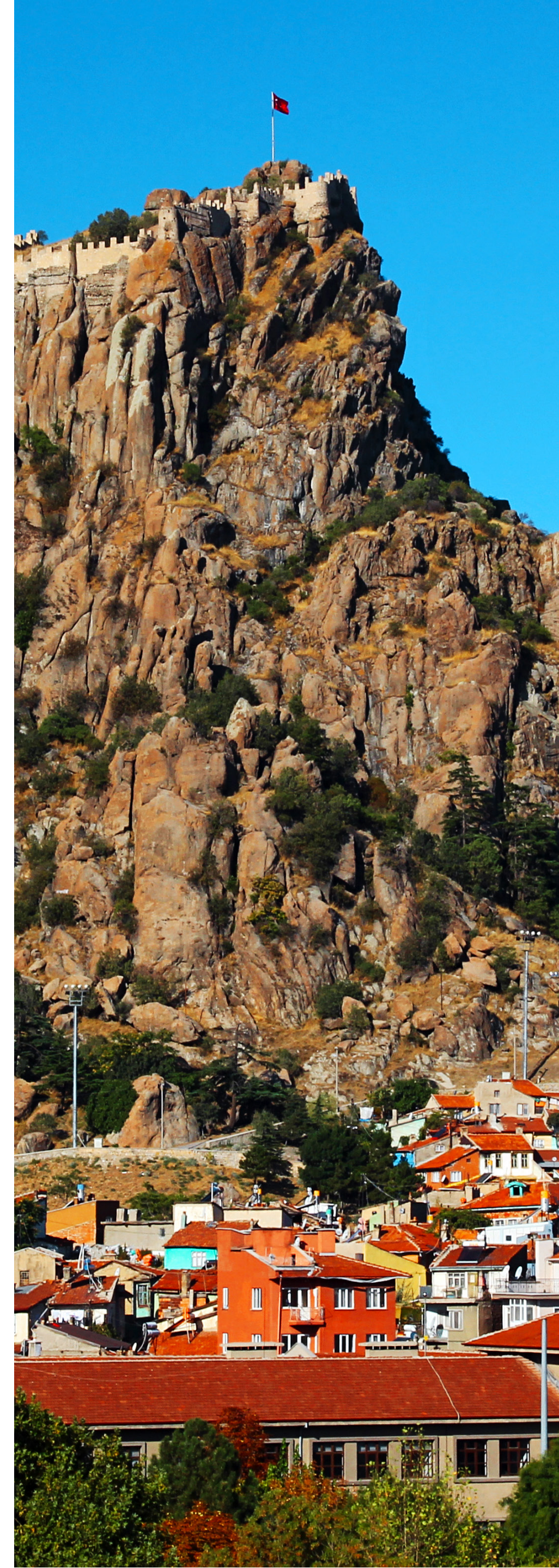

Phrygian Valley

A breathtaking landscape where nature and history intertwine. The region is dotted with rock-hewn dwellings, temples, and tombs, offering a glimpse into the daily life and beliefs of the Phrygians.



Afyonkarahisar Castle

A towering fortress on a volcanic rock, offering one of the best views of the region. The approximately 220 m high volcanic rock was first fortified around 1350 BC by the Hittites. Later it was occupied by Phrygians, Lydians, and the Persian Achaemenid Empire.

One of the world's oldest known human settlements, this Neolithic site offers a fascinating look at early urban life. Walking among its ancient ruins is like stepping into prehistoric history.

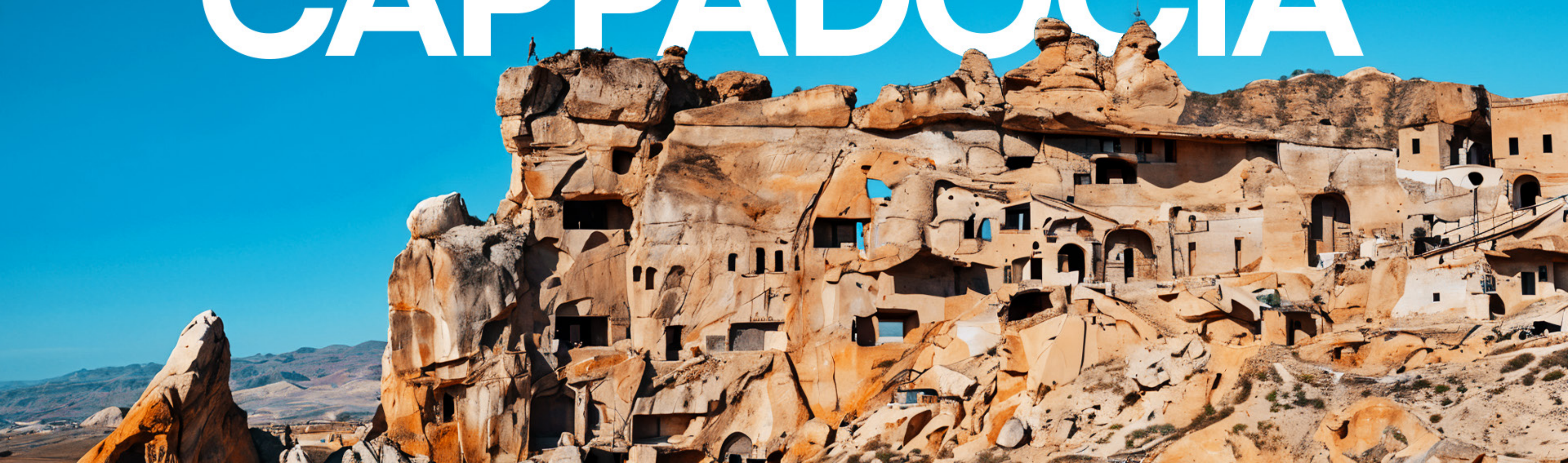


Mevlana Museum

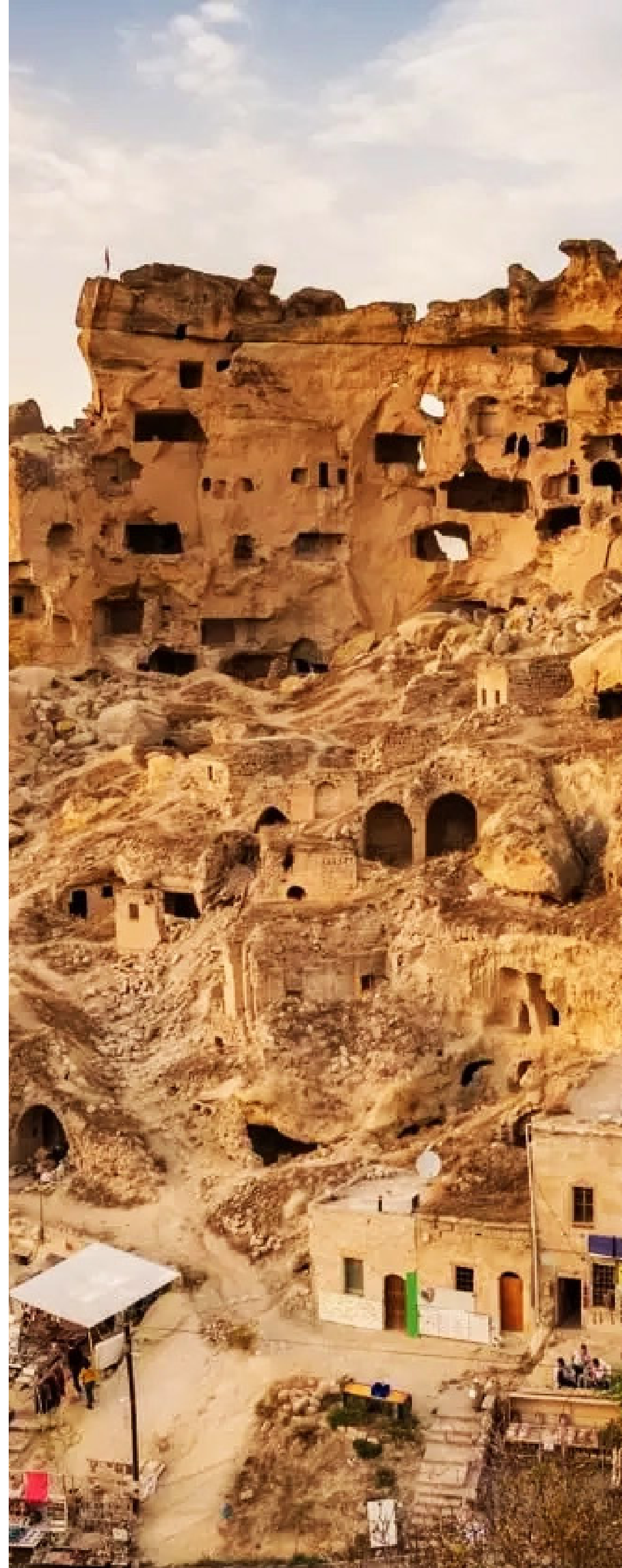
